Purpose

The purpose of the meeting was to coordinate the alternatives developed to date with City staff.

Summary of Discussion

Review of Alternative Concept Plans

Jim Phillips reviewed the alternative concept plans developed for removal or replacement of the existing bridge. (Note: The No-Build alternative will be considered a viable alternative throughout the study.) The following alternatives were discussed:

- No-Build with Permanent Removal of the Bridge
- Rehabilitation
- Replacement with a Low-Level Movable Bridge
- Replacement with a Mid-Level Fixed Bridge (with 27' 8 ½" of vertical clearance)
 - Option A
 - Option B

Issues including proposed grade, potential impacts to property, drainage issues and design were discussed for each alternative.

The Low-level movable bridge alternative can be constructed within existing right-of-way, assuming that no stormwater ponds would be constructed within the project corridor.

Options A and B for the Mid-Level fixed bridge alternative would have substantial right-of-way impacts. Proposed retaining walls would impact access to Riverside Drive for adjacent properties. Both options propose construction of access roads to preserve access to the Bayshore Mobile Home Park and to maintain the connection between Pampas Avenue and Venetian Court.

The maximum vertical clearance over the navigation channel proposed is 27' 8 ½" for the midlevel option. Higher vertical clearance would result in substantial impacts to the intersections of Chesapeake Drive and Forest Avenue with Riverside Drive, and construction would extend beyond the project limits.

Comments by Tom Funcheon and Gary Schurman

Tom and Gary discussed the drainage problems within the project corridor, particularly near Chesapeake Drive. Both indicated that the addition of a stormwater pond on the north side of Meeting Minutes September 13, 2012

Riverside Drive and/or located on the empty lot adjacent to the Tarpon Springs Yacht Club would be advantageous and suggested that it be added to the low-level bridge alternative plans.

Tom and Gary also believe there is an existing drainage pipe on the south side of Riverside Drive between Chesapeake Drive and the bridge that may be silted in. They would appreciate additional information on the condition of this pipe if available.

Gary noted that there is a driveway and garage on the south side of the road just west of Forest Avenue that may present grade challenges.

Community Involvement

Tom and Gary agreed that all of the alternatives developed, including the mid-level options should be presented at the Community Workshop.

Tom and Gary stated that the project team is encouraged to make a presentation to the City Commission that summarizes the alternatives to be presented at the Community Workshop.

Gary suggested contacting Karen Lemons, the City's new Development Director to inquire about a possible neighborhood representative for the Cultural Resource Committee (CRC).

Gary also stated that Gwen Neil publishes a newsletter for homeowners along Chesapeake Drive, although there is no organized homeowner association in that area. He will provide her contact information.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

No speaker shall have the right to address the Board of Commissioners for more than four (4) minutes on any particular item. Members of the public present at the meeting may donate their time to a speaker to extend the speaker's time but such donation shall forfeit the donator's right to speak. The speaker shall identify the persons who have donated their speaking time. Each donation shall extend the speaker's time an additional two (2) minutes. In no event shall the speaker's time be extended beyond ten (10) minutes of total speaking time. Any deviation from this rule must be approved by the consensus of a majority of the Board, but no vote need be taken to waive this requirement.

Each person addressing the City Commission shall approach the podium, shall give his or her name and address in an audible tone of voice. All remarks shall be addressed to the City Commission as a body, and not to any member thereof. All speakers, including City Commissioners, shall be recognized by the Mayor. No person, other than members of the City Commission and the person having the floor shall be permitted to enter into any discussion, either directly or through members of the City Commission. No questions

shall be asked to individual Commission members, except through the Mayor. Any person making personal, impertinent, or slanderous remarks, or who shall become boisterous while addressing the City Commission may be requested to leave the meeting and may forthwith be barred from further audience at that meeting.

PRESERVATION OF ORDER:

The Mayor shall preserve order and decorum, and shall prevent attacks on personalities or impugning of motives of particular members, and shall prevent digression from the question under discussion. The Mayor shall ensure that no boisterous conduct, such as cheering, clapping, or the like shall permitted during debate. The Chief of Police or his or her designate shall be the sergeant-at-arms of the City Commission.

APPEALS AND RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS:

If any person decides to appeal any decision made by the Board of Commissioners with respect to any matter considered at this meeting, he/she will need a record of the proceedings, and that for such purpose, he/she may need to ensure a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based. The City of Tarpon Spring does not furnish verbatim transcripts. Interested parties should make necessary arrangements for the verbatim transcript in advance.







Conclusions of Detailed Engineering Analysis

- Widening the bridge to provide improved sidewalks requires replacement of
 - Movable (Bascule) Span
 - Bascule piers which support the span
- No elements of the original bridge would remain









Reconfiguration of Existing Bridge – No Widening



Rehabilitation with reconfiguration of existing bridge to provide one 5.5' wide sidewalk without widening existing bridge

Conclusions of Detailed Engineering Analysis

- Not feasible Minimum typical section requires
 32.1 feet Approximately 4 feet wider than existing
- Widening would require replacement of bascule spans and piers
- No elements of the original bridge would remain





Rehabilitation Options - Costs



Original Rehabilitation Concept - \$9.5 M

(No Widening/No Sidewalk Improvements)

Rehabilitation (with Widening) - \$12.5 M

(Widened to provide two 5.5 ft wide sidewalks

Reconfiguration of Existing Bridge

(No widening, one 5.5 ft wide sidewalk)

Not Feasible

New Movable Bridge - \$15.8 M

(Provides two 6 ft sidewalks)





Life Cycle Cost Analysis



 Rehabilitate the bridge in 2020 then replace it with a new movable bridge in 2038 (25 years from 2013)

Versus

 Replace the bridge in 2020 with a new movable bridge

Result - More Cost Effective to Replace Bridge in 2020





Rehabilitation Options – SHPO Determination



SHPO Determinations

 Engineering Analysis provides "ample evidence" to support the project team's opinion that a new bridge would be preferable to the rehabilitation."

Mitigation will be required if existing bridge is demolished







SHPO concurred that Movable Bridge
 Alternative is preferred over Rehabilitation

- Project Team has determined that Fixed
 Bridge Alternatives are not feasible
- FHWA concurs that sufficient documentation has been presented to determine that Rehabilitation and Fixed Alternatives are not feasible





Current Project Status



Fixed Alternatives will Not Be Further Considered as Viable

- USCG determined that 28 feet of vertical clearance "Does Not Meet the Needs of Navigation"
- Substantial right-of-way impacts
- Substantial visual impacts
- Not consistent with historic character of community
- Requires two-year detour during construction
- Cost \$14 M \$15 M (including Right-of-way)
 compared to New Movable \$15.8 M







Rehabilitation – With Widening



Bascule Span Engineering

- Current design loading (HL-93) is heavier than existing bridge design load (most likely HS-15)
- Current standards require designing sidewalks for occasional vehicle load (which was not the case for the existing bascule span)
- Bridge rails are currently designed for much higher impact loads and specific "crash tested" geometry
- Minimum width roadway results in higher live loads on the girders, floorbeams and cantilever brackets (at least a 32 percent increase in main girder loading)
- Current design loadings for bridge rails will result in larger loads on the cantilever brackets as will the wider sidewalk

All main members of the bascule span need to be stronger (larger, heavier steel sections) than the existing





Rehabilitation – With Widening



Bascule Span Engineering

- New bridge deck will be approximately 37% wider than the existing
- New bascule span will be approximately 62% heavier than the existing
- Counterweight volume is limited by geometry of the existing bascule pier

Counterweight volume is not sufficient to provide the mass required to balance the span (would require 390 pcf concrete (AASHTO limits counterweight concrete to 315 pcf)





Rehabilitation – With Widening



Bascule Span Engineering

- Existing bascule pier is supported on timber piles of unknown number, length and/or capacity
- Helper piles installed in 1996 are not fully effective in supporting the bascule piers – they were designed to stabilize the pier, not support dead load or live load
- New bascule span will be approximately 62% heavier than the existing

Existing piers do not have capacity for the added dead and live loads resulting from widening













Mayor Archie called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

INVOCATION:

Reverend Raymond Stallworth, Mt. Moriah AME Church, gave the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG

Mayor Archie led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

The Mayor asked for public comments and there were none.

PROCLAMATIONS:

1. FARM CITY WEEK:

Mayor Archie proclaimed November 16-22, 2012 as Farm City Week. No one was at the meeting to accept the proclamation; therefore, the City Clerk would mail.

Mayor Archie asked for Board and public comments and there were none.

PRESENTATION:

2. CHAMBER OF COMMERCE BEAUTIFICATION AWARD:

Sue Thomas, President Tarpon Springs Chamber of Commerce, 111 East Tarpon Avenue, presented, Attorney Michael Kouskoutis, with the Chamber's Beautification Award. Mr. Kouskoutis thanked the Chamber for the recognition.

Mayor Archie thanked Mr. Kouskoutis for all he does for the City.

Mayor Archie asked for public comments and there were none.

3. BECKETT BRIDGE REHABILITATION, REPLACEMENT: ANN VENABLES, E.C. DRIVER & ASSOCIATES

Ann Venables, Project Manager gave a power point presentation highlighting the Beckett Bridge PD & E Study Alternatives; History of the Bridge; project needs; PD & E Process; Community Concerns; and various bridge options. Additionally she stated that the bridge was determined to be eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.

The Board thanked all and Pinellas County for making the presentation, and made known residents' concerns of the future bridge. Mayor Archie asked if money was the factor for the design of the bridge, when and where the next public meeting was. Ms. Venables replied that money was only one part of the factor and not the deciding one of the design, and the meeting would be held January 23, 2013 at the Yacht Club and would forward information for the City to post on their website. Commissioner Tarapani inquired if the County discussed any other types of bridge options like swing, and what the preference was based on the options. Mr. Driver said that yes, all options were looked at, and stated his preference, but did not have a preference on a high or low level. Commissioner Tarapani did not see eliminating a fixed bridge but was in favor of the option with the least impact to the city, and would like the residents affected in this matter to be treated with fairness. Commissioner Larsen asked about the bridge on the register, the sufficiency rating, and if the long term vision was also an aspect of the project. Mrs. Venables said that the bridge was unique as it was one of the oldest bridges of that style and then explained the formula on inspection rating and said that the primary thing driving the low rating was safety due to the narrow widths and no shoulders. Vice Mayor Alahouzos wanted to know if property owners were contacted, if during the construction or rehabilitation if the channel would be open and if dredging occur. (Continued)

3. BECKETT BRIDGE REHABILITATION, REPLACEMENT: ANN VENABLES, E.C. DRIVER & ASSOCIATES

Mrs. Venables responded that property owners were not contacted yet that at this time they were reviewing options, the channel would be shut for a brief time and that they would not be dredging.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Bill Vinson, 144 Spring Boulevard, former Commissioner, shared with the Board what Riparian Rights are according to the Florida Statute 253.141. Mr. Vinson felt resident issues were not addressed in presentation nor were the importance of these rights made clear.

Mayor Archie encouraged residents to attend this meeting because the Board of Commissioner's voice was no more powerful than the resident's voice on this County project.

4. CYCADIA CEMETERY SECURITY IMPROVEMENTS

Paul Smith, Public Services Director, presented a power point on Cycadia Cemetery security improvements, and gave background that this has come about due to vandalism throughout the years.

The Board thanked Mr. Smith for bringing forward. Mayor Archie felt this was much needed and questioned the gate. Mr. Smith said that anyone already in the cemetery would be able to exit. Vice Mayor Alahouzos knew that the fence was something that was dear to the late Mr. Powell, Cycadia Cemetery Chairman, and former Commissioner. Additionally, Vice Mayor Alahouzos would like to see landscaping placed along the fencing. Commissioner Tarapani asked why the fence was not on top of existing cement wall and if lighted columns will go between areas of fencing, and Mr. Smith said placing fencing on wall was explored and it was not strong enough and someone could climb and go over. As far as the columns, it would be explored and if too expensive can always do at a later time.
