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1.0 REPORT OVERVIEW


This report provides the documentation associated with the Public Involvement Program that was developed and implemented for the Cobb Road (CR 485) & US 98 Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study. The purpose of this program was to establish and maintain communication with the public at-large, as well as with individuals, elected officials, and agencies who may have an interest in the project. This program afforded all citizens the opportunity to understand the planned project and express concerns about the project. It has been carried out in compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act, as amended. Federal, state, regional, and local agencies and governments with a concern in the planned project because of jurisdictional review or expressed interest, as well as potentially affected and interested individuals, were identified over the course of the PD&E study through meetings, announcements, and mailings, as described in this report. In an effort to resolve all issues identified, the Department has conducted an interagency coordination and consultation effort and public participation process. This document details the Department's efforts to fully identify, address, and resolve all project-related issues identified through the Public Involvement Program.

The methods for disseminating information about this study were an Advance Notification package, which was distributed to appropriate federal, state, regional, and local agencies, a kickoff meeting for elected and appointed officials, a Public Workshop, and a Public Hearing. Each of these events is summarized in this report. Also included are comments from the public and review agencies, along with Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) responses to those comments, as well as copies of handout materials provided at the public meetings and the Public Hearing transcript.

2.0 PROJECT SUMMARY

The FDOT conducted a PD&E Study to find the most appropriate alignment and design concept for the proposed widening of Cobb Road (CR 485) from SR 50 to US 98 and a portion of US 98, from Cobb Road to the Suncoast Parkway, in Hernando County, Florida (Exhibit 1). The objectives of the PD&E Study were to evaluate and document engineering and environmental issues associated with the proposed improvements and to determine the potential effects associated with the alternatives developed during the study, including the "No-Build" alternative. This would help the FDOT and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to reach a decision on the type, design, and location of the necessary improvements. The PD&E study also satisfies the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and FHWA requirements in order to receive federal funding for the design, right-of-way acquisition, and construction of the recommended improvements.

The existing Cobb Road from SR 50 to Shadyside Drive is a 4-lane divided facility, with a 24-foot (ft.) raised median, 12-ft. inside lanes, 14-ft. outside lanes, and 5-ft. sidewalks. From Shadyside Drive to US 98, the existing Cobb Road is a 2-lane rural facility with 12-ft lanes and

10-ft. shoulders, 4 feet of which are paved. The existing US 98 from Cobb Road to the Suncoast Parkway is a 2-lane rural facility with 12-ft lanes and 8-ft. shoulders, 4 feet of which are paved. Both Cobb Road and US 98 have open drainage ditches.

The Study evaluated a series of improvement alternatives intended to increase safety and meet future traffic demand along the project corridor. These improvements are an important element of the regional roadway network and are included in the Hernando County Metropolitan Planning Organization's 2025 Long Range Transportation Plan. The recommended alternative identified in the Study is described below.

For this PD&E Study, the project was divided into segments for analysis. The segments of Cobb Road were chosen based on surrounding characteristics such as land use and environmental constraints, as well as the potential need for realignments. The segments of US 98 were chosen to match FDOT resurfacing project limits for consistency. The project segmentation is shown on the Project Location Map in Exhibit 1. The segments of the project are identified as follows:

- Segment 1a: Cobb Road from north of SR 50 to north of the Brooksville Water Reclamation Facility (WRF) driveway
- Segment 1b: Cobb Road from north of the Brooksville WRF driveway to north of Yontz Road
- Segment 2a: Cobb Road from north of Yontz Road to south of US 98
- Segment 2b: Cobb Road/US 98 Intersection
- Segment 3: US 98 from north of Cobb Road to CR 491
- Segment 4: US 98 from CR 491 to Suncoast Parkway

The recommended typical section for Segment 1a is an urban typical section consisting of two 12-ft. travel lanes in each direction, a 6-ft. sidewalk on the left (west) side and a 12-ft. shared use path on the right (east) side. This typical section utilizes a 17.5-ft. median and fits within the existing right-of-way width (minimum 100 ft.). The proposed design speed is 45 mph. The preferred typical section for Segment 1b and for the portion of Segment 2a south of Youth Drive is a suburban typical section consisting of two 12-ft. travel lanes in each direction with 8-ft. outside shoulders (5 ft. paved) and a 12-ft. shared use path on the right (east) side. This typical section utilizes a 30-ft. median (22-ft. curb to curb and 4-ft. offsets to edge of inside travel lanes). The proposed design speed is 55 mph. The preferred typical section for Segment 2a north of Youth Drive and Segments 2b, 3 and 4 is a rural typical section consisting of two 12-ft. travel lanes, 8-ft. outside shoulders (5-ft. paved) and 6-ft. inside shoulders (4-ft. paved) in each direction, and a 12-ft. shared use path on the right (east) side. The proposed design speed is 70 mph.

3.0 ADVANCE NOTIFICATION

As required by State and Federal law, the FDOT initiated an Advance Notification (AN) process to inform a number of Federal, State, and local agencies of this project and its scope of anticipated activities. The AN package, which consisted of a transmittal letter, a project fact sheet, and a project location map, was distributed to the appropriate Federal, State, regional, and local agencies on August 6, 2001. Comment: No Comment/Consistent.

Response: No response required.

Withlacoochee Regional Planning Council

(Appendix A, Exhibit 2)

Comment: The planned project has been found to be regionally significant and consistent

with adopted goals, objectives, and policies of the Strategic Regional Policy Plan.

Response: No response required.

Florida Department of Environmental Protection

(Appendix A, Exhibit 3)

Comment: The study is consistent with the Department's authorities in the Florida Coastal

Management Program. However, as detailed project information is not yet available, the Department cannot determine the consistency of the road

improvement at this time

Response: No response required.

Comment: As noted on the Advance Notification Fact Sheet, roadway construction activities

will require issuance of an Environmental Resource Permit (ERP) by the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD), pursuant to Part N of Chapter 373, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Rules 62-113, 40D-4, and 40D-40, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). Early coordination of project plans with

the SWFWMD is recommended.

Response: The FDOT will coordinate and meet with the SWFWMD during the design phase

of the project. All construction activities will comply with applicable Florida statutes and administrative codes, and an ERP application will be developed and

submitted in preparation for these activities.

Comment: The ERP applicant will be required to eliminate or reduce any proposed wetland

resource impacts to the greatest extent practicable.

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Response: No response required.

Comment:

The planned project lies within the Brooksville Ridge physiographic region and part of a large hammock belt known historically as the "Big Hammock." The roadways traverse the Annutteliga Hammock, an area of karst topography with high environmental value. In addition to the CARL-acquired sites, numerous proposed acquisition sites may be impacted by roadway construction and/or expansion. Much of the region has been targeted for preservation through the Water Management Lands Trust Fund, Save Our Rivers Program, as it is an area of high groundwater recharge to the Upper Floridan aquifer, contains unique and valuable natural systems, and is of significant historical and archaeological importance.

Response:

No impacts are anticipated to any lands or properties that belong to CARL, Water Management Lands Trust Fund, Save Our Rivers Program, or any other Federal, State, or local agencies. A geotechnical survey was conducted during the PD&E phase, detecting no areas of karst geology within the FDOT right-of-way. The ERP process includes stormwater and dredge and fill activity review for all construction. Construction activities will adhere to and comply with Federal and State permitting requirements for avoidance, minimization and compensation of wetland impacts, the management of water quantity and quality, and the preservation of all cultural and natural resources. No impacts to the Annutteliga Hammock are expected.

Comment:

Surface land uses and activities in this area can have direct impacts to groundwater. Per section 62-40.310(1)(h), F.A.C., the Department's review of all programs, rules, and plans seeks to "protect aquifers from depletion through water conservation and preservation of the functions of high recharge areas." Because the roadway improvements project is located in this critical area, we recommend that the ERP applicant consider a full range of planning strategies to utilize Best Management Practices (BMPs), buffer wetland areas, and treat stormwater to protect groundwater and adjacent surface water resources.

Response:

The FDOT will apply for an ERP during the design phase of the project. The permitting process requires that water quality and quantity, wetland impacts, groundwater and surface water protection, aquifer recharge, and habitats and protected species be addressed. The FDOT will plan and implement the required and necessary BMPs and other acceptable methodologies to minimize and mitigate all impacts to natural resources.

Comment:

The project area is in the vicinity of numerous recorded and unrecorded archaeological sites. The Department recommends that the proposed cultural resource assessment survey be conducted by a professional archaeologist and coordinated throughout with the Division of Historical Resources.

Response:

A Cultural Resource Assessment, conducted in accordance with the procedures contained in 36 CFR Part 800 and including background research and a field survey coordinated with the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO), was performed for the project. No archaeological or historical sites or properties are expected to be encountered during subsequent project development. The FHWA, after consultation with the SHPO, has determined that no resources listed or eligible for listing on the NRHP would be impacted. The SHPO coordination letter is shown in Appendix A, Exhibit 3-A.

Florida Department of Community Affairs

Comment: The State has determined that, at this stage, the proposed action is consistent with

the Florida Coastal Management Program. However, detailed project information is not yet available and therefore, DEP cannot determine the consistency of the

project at this time.

Response: The planned project has been reviewed by the Florida Department of Community

Affairs and has been deemed consistent with the Florida Department of Environmental Protection's Coastal Management Program, as confirmed by a

letter dated December 7, 2001.

4.0 PUBLIC OFFICIALS/AGENCY KICKOFF MEETING

A project "kickoff" notification letter was submitted to local and regional elected and appointed officials for an August 29, 2001 meeting which was held at the Lykes Memorial Library in Brooksville from 10:00 a.m. to noon. No responses were received as a result of this notification.

The purpose of the meeting was to conduct an informal meeting for elected officials and public agency representatives in the Brooksville/Hernando County area to apprise them of the project's purpose and schedule, and to receive input from them on issues and concerns related to the proposed improvements to Cobb Road (CR 485) from SR 50 to US 98 and US 98 from Cobb Road to the Suncoast Parkway.

Information displayed and distributed at the meeting included a project location aerial map and a project fact sheet with a comment form. One-on-one discussions to answer questions and obtain information were conducted. Copies of the meeting sign-in sheets and handout materials are attached as Appendix B.

5.0 AGENCY COORDINATION

In addition to Advance Notification, coordination took place with jurisdictional and other local agencies over the course of the study process, as described below. Copies of pertinent correspondence are contained in Appendix C.

U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) was consulted regarding potential impacts to the Cooley's water willow (*Justicia cooleyi*), a federally-protected plant species. This species was found to be present in a disturbed area on the east side of Cobb Road, just north of the CSX railroad crossing. Coordination with the USFWS on this issue resulted in a determination that the planned project is not likely to adversely affect this species. (See letter dated January 7, 2003, in Appendix C.)

CSX Transportation

CSX Transportation was consulted to coordinate two CSX railroad crossings along the project. One is a spur crossing on US 98 near Lake Lindsey Road which appears to be abandoned. CSX indicated that this crossing must continue to be shown on maps and that FDOT must agree to replace the crossing, pending the approval of a permit for a new concrete plant to be served by this line. The second is on Cobb Road just north of Yontz Road, where a siding switch is located within the proposed right-of-way of the project. The switch cannot be left in the crossing and would need to be relocated. CSX proposed a double track crossing and relocation of the switch to the west side of Cobb Road. FDOT representatives agreed that this appeared to be the best solution because it would allow the proposed alignment of the widening improvements to stand. CSX will continue to coordinate the relocation of the switch and track redesign with FDOT during the final design of proposed improvements to Cobb Road.

6.0 PUBLIC INFORMATION WORKSHOP

A Public Workshop was held for the study on Thursday, June 13, 2002, from 4:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. at Dolores S. Parrott Middle School, 9220 Youth Drive, in Brooksville. A newsletter announcing the meeting and describing the study process was prepared and distributed 21 days prior to the Workshop to elected officials, agencies, and property owners within 300 feet of the centerline of the recommended alternative through the length of the project.

The format of the Workshop was informal, with displays available for review and a comment box for submittal of written comments. A project audio-visual presentation ran continuously over the course of the Workshop. FDOT representatives were available to answer questions and receive verbal comments. The study's Draft Preliminary Engineering Report was available for review at the Workshop.

To help organize the study alternatives, the project was divided into four segments, corresponding to the different roadway corridor characteristics in the study area. Segment 1 extended from SR 50 to just north of Yontz Road; Segment 2 continued from this point to just beyond the Cobb Road-US 98 intersection. Segment 3 extended along US 98 to County Road 491, with Segment 4 continuing from this point to the end of the project at the Suncoast Parkway. Three basic design concepts were presented for consideration: an urban design, a suburban design, and a rural design. Study alternatives incorporating these concepts were presented for each segment. The "No Build" alternative limited work in the project area to routine maintenance and does not have any impacts associated with it.

The urban design concept included two 12-ft. lanes in each direction, full curbs and gutters on both the inside and outside of the roadway, and a 46-ft. wide raised median. A 5-ft. wide sidewalk would be built on the west side of the roadway, and a 12-ft. wide shared use path for pedestrians, bicyclists and other users would be built on the east side. The suburban design concept was similar except that it included 8-ft. wide shoulders and ditches on the outside, instead of curbs and gutters, and a narrower, 22-ft. wide raised median. The inside lanes would be separated from the median by a 4-ft. wide paved shoulder. The rural design concept included ditches instead of curbs and gutters and a shared use path instead of a sidewalk. With a minimum width of 240 feet, this design would require the greatest right-of-way width of the three concepts.

Three project alternatives were presented for Segment 1: an urban design concept and a suburban design concept both with new right-of-way on the west side of the existing road, and a suburban design concept that would be built to save the pavement of the existing roadway. Project alternatives presented for the other three road segments were all based on the rural design concept. Three variations were presented for Segment 2: one built on a western alignment; one built for "best fit", meandering along the existing road where necessary; and one built to save the existing pavement. One project alternative was presented for Segments 3 and 4: an alignment along the southwest side of the existing roadway.

Approximately 43 individuals signed the attendance record. Fourteen comment forms were received at the Workshop or in the mail following the Workshop. Copies of the Workshop notification materials, sign-in sheets, handout materials, and evaluation matrix are attached as Appendix D.

7.0 PUBLIC HEARING

The Public Hearing for the planned project was held on November 21, 2002, at Dolores S. Parrott Middle School, 9220 Youth Drive, in Brooksville. An informal open house period took place from 4:30 p.m. until 7:30 p.m., with a formal presentation given at 6:00 p.m. A newsletter announcing the meeting and describing the project was prepared and distributed 21 days prior to the Hearing to elected officials, agencies, and property owners within 300 feet of the centerline of the recommended alternative through the length of the project.

The purpose of the Hearing was to provide the public with specific information regarding the study's recommended alternative. The hearing also provided an opportunity for area property owners and other residents to express their views on the project, its potential for impact, and other related matters. The public record for the Hearing remained open until December 2, 2002. A transcript was prepared to officially document all proceedings and citizen comments.

As a result of input received at the Public Workshop and throughout the public involvement process, the following project alternative was selected as the Recommended Alternative. Segment 1 from SR 50 to the driveway leading to the City of Brooksville Cobb Road Water Reclamation Facility would use the urban typical section, designed to generally fit within the existing right-of-way (minimum 100 feet). North of the Reclamation Facility driveway, Segment 1 would use a suburban typical section following a left alignment, with approximately 38 feet of additional right-of-way acquired from the west side of Cobb Road. Segment 2 would begin with

the same suburban typical, transitioning just north of Youth Drive to a rural typical section on a left alignment; this would require approximately 120 feet of additional right-of-way along the west side. Segments 3 and 4 would continue the rural typical section on a left alignment and would require 40 feet of additional right-of-way on the southwest side of US 98.

The Recommended Alternative also involves designating existing Cobb Road as US 98 to provide a route bypassing downtown Brooksville. The existing Cobb Road intersection with US 98 would be realigned to allow southbound and northbound through movements between existing Cobb Road and US 98 to the north.

Excluding FDOT personnel, 42 individuals signed the attendance register. Copies of the Hearing notification materials, sign-in sheets, handout materials, evaluation matrix, and transcript are attached as Appendix E. Specific questions and comments raised at the Hearing were answered during informal discussions, by letter, or are answered in this report. Five written comment forms or letters were received and six official statements were made for the record. Informal comments were also made over the course of the Hearing. While some of the comments made at the Hearing and in the letters and comment forms received following it were of a general nature, the following summarizes the substantive comments made.

Comment: The proposed design of driveway connections at the Cobb Road-US 98

intersection is inadequate and will negatively affect the values and potential uses

of affected properties.

Response: The Department of Transportation must re-establish any driveway connections

that were disrupted or altered as a result of a roadway project. No access is being eliminated at the Cobb Road-US 98 intersection that will not be replaced. The final disposition of rights-of-way and frontage would be determined during the

right-of-way acquisition stage of the project.

Comment: The project will exacerbate existing drainage problems at the Cobb Road-US 98

intersection. Standard retention ponds may not control runoff from the highway.

Response: A detailed drainage analysis was conducted as part of the PD&E study,

indicating the measures to be taken to ensure the project does not contribute to

any existing drainage problems.

Comment: It is of concern that Brittle Road is to be paved one-half mile in each direction

from its intersection with US 98 when the road simply leads to an abandoned

mine.

Response: The proposed paying of a portion of Brittle Road is not due to mining operations

but, rather, because Brittle Road is a public right-of-way.

Comment: The proposed raised median at the intersection of Fort Dade Avenue and Cobb

Road will cause difficulties for area residents traveling on Fort Dade and will negatively impact the retail gas station at the northeast corner of the intersection.

Response: The partial median opening proposed at this intersection is in keeping with

adopted access management standards. With Cobb Road being converted into a US route (which is one of the main reasons for the project), more stringent access

controls are necessary.

Comment: The acceleration lane on southbound Cobb Road at the Yontz Road intersection

is inadequate.

Response: The design of this intersection would be further examined in during the Design

Phase of the project.

Comment: Why will certain intersections be realigned and not others?

Response: The proposed realignment of the Brittle Road intersection is to eliminate a severe

skew in the angle at which this road crosses US 98. The severity of the existing skew makes development of a safe intersection difficult without a realignment.

Comment: A sound barrier wall should be installed along Cobb Road to buffer the noise

generated by increased truck traffic.

Response: A detailed noise analysis was conducted as part of this Project Development and

Environment Study. The analysis revealed there are 56 potential noise sensitive receptor locations identified along the project corridor where noise may increase due to the planned project. Twenty-one of the 56 potential receptor sites were found to experience an increase in noise levels as a result of the planned project. Noise barrier modeling conducted on the impacted receptors found that there are no apparent solutions available to mitigate the noise impacts at these receptors. Therefore, based on the results of the evaluation, noise abatement barriers are not

feasible.

Construction of the planned project will have a temporary affect on the noise sensitive sites adjacent to the project corridor. Trucks, earth moving and pile driving equipment, pumps and generators are construction noise sources. The contractor will adhere to the 2000 FDOT Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction and any special provisions in the construction contract related to the

control of noise.

Comment: US 98 should use the suburban typical cross-section, which is 150 feet wide,

rather than the rural typical cross-section, which is 240 feet wide. The 240-foot road would exceed the needs of the area. In addition, to improve safety, a traffic

signal should be installed at the intersection of 491 and US 98.

Response: Roadway and land use conditions along US 98 warrant a facility that allows for

safe accommodation of high speed traffic. The rural typical cross section is the preferred choice in this area. At the present time the traffic volumes using this

intersection do not meet the criteria for installation of a traffic light. This issue may be further examined during the design phase of the project.

Comment: Shared use path will be rendered unsafe where driveways cross the path to access

Cobb Road. This is a particular problem because trucks carrying heavy equipment and machinery must access businesses along Cobb Road via these

driveways.

Response: The rules governing the proposed shared use path would be no different than

those governing normal sidewalks. Given the high volume of rock hauling trucks on Cobb Road itself, a separate path that provides the required accommodation of bicyclists and pedestrians will be safer than the option of forcing bicyclists onto

the roadway itself.

8.0 SUMMARY

This report describes the Public and Agency Involvement Program undertaken for the Cobb Road (CR 485) and US 98 PD&E Study. The program's primary elements included: 1) distribution of an Advance Notification package, 2) a Public Information Workshop, and 3) a Public Hearing.

The level of agency interest in this study was low, while public concerns primarily focused on the economic effects on small business, and the need for timely development of the project.



STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ADVANCE NOTIFICATION FACT SHEET

- 1. Need for Project: The Hernando County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and the FDOT have identified the need to make improvements to CR 485 (Cobb Road) from SR 50 to US 98, and US 98 from CR 485 to the North Suncoast Parkway in Hernando County, Florida. The majority of the project lies within unincorporated Hernando County. However, a small portion of the project lies within the City of Brooksville city limits, at the southeastern end of the project. The need for capacity improvement to this section of CR 485 and US 98 is included in the Hernando County MPO's 2020 Long Range Transportation Plan (adopted December 1998). In addition, to the capacity improvements, the project is to provide a safer enhanced route for truck traffic to use in bypassing downtown Brooksville.
- 2. Description of the Project: The proposed Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study limits for this project are on CR 485 (Cobb Road) from SR 50 to US 98, and US 98 from CR 485 to North Suncoast Parkway. The total length of the study is approximately 11.5 miles (18.55 kilometers). A project location map is attached.

3. Environmental Information:

- a. Land Uses: The project study area contains mostly rural and agricultural land uses, as well as scattered single-family residential and commercial uses in the southern portion of the corridor. Large rock and sand mining operations are located to the north and west of the study corridor. Notable land uses along the corridor include D.S. Parrott Middle School, Wever Park, the Annutteliga Hammock Conservation and Recreation Lands (CARL) site, and three major mining facilities.
- b. Wetlands: Wetlands occur throughout the project area and include several types. Hydric hammocks, ditches and swales, small lakes and ponds, freshwater marshes, and floodplain wetlands are present in the proposed study area. Impacts to wetlands are expected to be minimal, as the majority of wetlands that abut the highway are roadside swales and upland ditches.
- c. Floodplains: Based on Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) prepared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), the project is located in the vicinity of Flood Zone A, which is classified as "areas of 100 year flood; base flood elevations and flood hazard factors not determined." Potential impacts will be evaluated as set forth in Executive Order 11988 "Floodplain Management" and 23 CFR 650 and coordinated with the appropriate regulatory agencies.

- Wildlife and Habitat: Coordination with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation d. Commission (FFWCC), Florida Natural Areas Inventory (FNAI), and U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS) will be conducted during the PD&E Study. Due to the location of the project in the vicinity of the Annutteliga Hammock there is potential for the occurrence of both faunal and floral rare and/or protected species. Based on identified habitat types and information provided by the regulatory agencies, protected species surveys will be conducted by experienced wildlife biologists. Specific field surveys for protected species that potentially occur within the study area will be conducted following established survey protocols and guidance provided by the regulatory agencies. Potential impacts to wildlife/protected species will be assessed and appropriate mitigation and minimization measures will be developed. Known occurrences of protected species in the project area include the Southeastern American Kestrel, the Florida sandhill crane, and other wading birds. The potential for involvement with the Florida black bear exists, as the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FFWCC) has identified bear habitat within the project area.
- e. Outstanding Florida Waters: There are no waterbodies within the project study area designated as Outstanding Florida Waters.
- f. Aquatic Preserves: There are no State Aquatic Preserves within the project study area.
- g. Coastal Zone Consistency: A Coastal Zone Consistency determination is required.
- h. Cultural Resources: Previous surveys of the area indicate that there are potential structures located in the study area, which may be eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. The Florida Site File also lists potential archaeological sites in the study area. A cultural resource assessment survey (CRAS) will be conducted during the PD&E Study to identify all historic and archaeological sites eligible for listing on the NRHP.
- i. Coastal Barrier Resources: There are no Coastal Barrier Resource Units in the study area.
- j. Contamination: Based on a preliminary field reconnaissance and FDEP files review, there are potential hazardous material and/or contamination sites within the project corridor. However, there are no federal or state Superfund sites present. It is expected that the proposed study will have minimal contamination involvement, if there is any involvement it will involve retail petroleum facilities. A contamination screening evaluation will be conducted in accordance with Chapter 22 of the FDOT PD&E Manual.
- k. Sole Source Aquifer: The project is not located within a sole source aquifer.

- 4. Navigable Waterway Crossings: None.
- 5. **Permits Required:** Various permit applications may be required to be filed and approved prior to construction. Agencies which may have an interest from a permitting standpoint include, but may not be limited to, the following (actual permits required will be determined during subsequent project development):

The Department has reviewed the above referenced Advance Notification from the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and Federal Highway Administration to conduct a study of CR 485 (Cobb Road) & US 98 capacity and truck route traffic improvements. Funding for the Federal aid action and PD&E study is consistent with the Department's authorities in the Florida Coastal Management Program. However, as detailed project information is not yet available, the Department cannot determine the consistency of the road improvements project at this time. Additional information is required concerning the anticipated roadway width, design, impacts, construction, and mitigation for any proposed wetland impacts. Further evaluation(s) of the project will be conducted during the environmental documentation and permitting stages. Future consistency will be based in part on adequate consideration of comments offered in this and subsequent reviews. Department staff offer the following comments and recommendations:

- As noted on the Advance Notification Fact Sheet, roadway construction activities will require issuance of an Environmental Resource Permit (ERP) by the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD), pursuant to Part IV of Chapter 373, Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Rules 62-113, 40D-4, and 40D-40, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.). Early coordination of project plans with the SWFWMD is recommended.
- ♦ The permit applicant will be required to eliminate or reduce any proposed wetland resource impacts to the greatest extent practicable:
 - Minimization should emphasize avoidance-oriented corridor alignments, wetland fill reductions via steep or vertically retained side slopes, and median width reductions within safety limits.
 - Wetlands should not be displaced by the installation of stormwater conveyance and treatment swales; compensatory treatment in adjacent uplands is the preferred afternatives of the prefer
 - After avoidance and minimization have been exhausted, mitigation must be proposed to offset the adverse impacts of the project to existing wetland functions and values.

- Significant attention is given to forested wetland systems, which are difficult to mitigate.
- The cumulative impacts of concurrent and future road improvement projects in the vicinity of the subject project should also be addressed.
- ♦ Please note: The proposed project lies within the Brooksville Ridge physiographic region and part of a large hammock belt known historically as the "Big Hammock." The roadways traverse the Annutteliga Hammock − an area of karst topography with high rolling hills, formed valleys, prairie basins, lakes, unique northern hardwood forests, and high-quality longleaf pine sandhills. In addition to the CARL-acquired sites, numerous proposed acquisition sites may be impacted by roadway construction and/or expansion. Much of the region has been targeted for preservation through the Water Management Lands Trust Fund, Save Our Rivers Program, as it is an area of high groundwater recharge to the Upper Floridan aquifer, contains unique and valuable natural systems, and is of significant historical and archaeological importance.

Surface land uses and activities in this area can have direct impacts to groundwater. Per section 62-40.310(1)(h), F.A.C., the Department's review of all programs, rules, and plans seeks to "[p]rotect aquifers from depletion through water conservation and preservation of the functions of high recharge areas." Because the roadway improvements project is located in this critical area, we recommend that the ERP permit applicant consider a full range of planning strategies to utilize Best Management Practices, buffer wetland areas, and treat stormwater to protect groundwater and adjacent surface water resources.

• The project area is in the vicinity of numerous recorded (and unrecorded, but known to local collectors) archaeological sites. The Department recommends that the proposed cultural resource assessment survey be conducted by a professional archaeologist and coordinated throughout with the Division of Historical Resources.

The archaeological field survey identified and evaluated eight previously recorded archaeological sites (8HE28, 8HE67-71, and 8HE73-74) and four newly recorded sites (8HE461-462 and 8HE477-478) within the APE. None of these 12 archaeological sites are considered potentially eligible for listing in the *NRHP*. In addition, two archaeological occurrences were found.

The historic structures field survey identified and evaluated 10 newly discovered historic resources (8HE439-443 and 8HE445-449) within the APE. One of these historic resources, the Hammock Consolidated School (HCS) (8HE447) is considered potentially eligible for listing in the *NRHP* under Criterion A in the areas of education and community planning and development. The HCS was constructed in 1941 as a two-teacher schoolhouse, constructed of locally quarried stone. Although minimal modifications have been made, the building conveys its historic function as a rural schoolhouse. A *NRHP* Registration Form has been prepared and included in the CRAS. The potential *NRHP* boundaries for the historic structure are located adjacent to, but outside of the existing right-of-way. Located at the corner of U.S. 98 and CR 491, the HCS fronts CR 491, facing east, and the proposed improvements recommend widening to the other (south) side of U.S. 98. Therefore, the proposed roadway improvements appear to have no physical involvement with this potentially *NRHP*-eligible structure. None of the remaining nine historical resources are considered potentially eligible for listing in the *NRHP*.

Based on the information presented in the CRAS, the FHWA has determined that none of the historic properties and archaeological sites, except for the HCS (8HE477), is considered eligible for listing in the NRHP. Based on the information presented in the CRAS and the application of adverse effects criteria included in 36 CFR Part 800.5, the FHWA has determined that the HCS is eligible for listing in the NRHP, and that this proposed undertaking would have no effect on the Hammock Consolidated School. Pursuant to 36 CFR Part 800.8; we request your review and concurrence with the above stated determination of eligibility and effect.







However, CSX representatives stated that it is technically still in use, but that its continued use is subject to a permit application by Florida Rock who is trying to obtain permits for a new concrete plant that would be served by this line. CSX asked that the crossing continue to be shown until the concrete plant permit application is resolved. If the future design of the widened US 98 eliminates the crossing, FDOT must agree to replacing the crossing at a future date in accordance with the pending permit application.
- 2. Cobb Road Crossing of CSX railroad north of Yontz Road. A siding switch is located just west of the existing pavement of Cobb Road. The proposed widening of Cobb Road is along a western alignment to avoid a population of a federally listed plant species. As a result, the switch would be located within the proposed right-of-way and probably within the pavement. CSX indicated that the switch cannot be left in the crossing and would need to be relocated and that there needs to be a 15-foot clearance from the centerline of track. CSX recommended that FDOT show a relocation of the rail line/siding spur and switch in their concept plans for the project. No curves less than 10

degrees can be used and the switch must be located beyond the point of spiral curve. Between spirals there must be 100 feet of tangent. It will cost \$175 per foot (excluding grading and drainage) to relocate the rail line. Mainline track must have spiral curves, but spurs can use up to 10 degree simple curves. Actual design of the relocated track should be coordinated with Mike Duke at CSX. During our meeting Mr. Pollock conferred by cell phone with his office regarding the requirements of the Railroad at this crossing.

Purpose of Meeting

The meeting was held to further coordinate the crossing of the CSX tracks on Cobb Road just north of Yontz Rd. where a switch is located close to the existing roadway. Earlier coordination in April had indicated that the switch could be moved with some realignment of the spur to the west. Now CSX is concerned that this may not be feasible for their operations.

Summary of Discussion

- 1. Existing Railroad ROW. Mike Duke of CSX indicated that their ROW extended 50 feet on either side of the centerline of tracks for both the spur and the mainline. In order to modify the track alignments and relocate the switch, additional ROW will be needed.
- 2. Proposed FDOT Widening of Cobb Road in vicinity of Crossing of CSX railroad north of Yontz Road. A public hearing for the four-laning of Cobb Rd. and US 98 is scheduled for November 21, 2002. The design concept to be presented will require right-of-way from the west side only. A siding switch is located just west of the existing pavement of Cobb Road. The proposed widening of Cobb Road is along a western alignment to avoid a population of a federally listed plant species. As a result, the existing switch would be located within the proposed FDOT right-of-way and probably within the median of the proposed four-lane divided facility.
- 3. CSX Concerns and Proposed Solution. CSX indicated earlier that the existing switch cannot be left in the crossing and would need to be relocated. Now, CSX is concerned that the spur line curvature required to relocate the switch would not work with the

newer trains using these tracks. As an alternative to relocating the improvements to Cobb Road to the east, which would effect property not previously effected, and impact the federally listed plant species, CSX proposed a double track crossing and relocation of the switch to the west side of Cobb Road. FDOT representatives agreed that this concept appeared to be the best solution, because it would allow the proposed alignment of the widening improvements to stand. CSX will perform a design evaluation of the double track crossing with the switch relocation to the west and report back to FDOT in about one month.

4. **Cobb Road/US 98 PD&E Study Status.** No changes to the conceptual design drawings will be made prior to the November 21, 2002 Public Hearing. The final solution to be developed by CSX in cooperation with FDOT will be included in the design phase of the project.



The Cobb Road/US 98 PD&E Study

A Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study is being conducted by the Florida Department of Transportation for the proposed widening of Cobb Road (County Road 485) and a portion of US 98. The project would include four-laning the entire length of Cobb Road and four-laning a portion of US 98 (see Project Location Map).

The PD&E Study is being conducted to find the most appropriate alignment and design concept for the widening, determine the potential effects associated with the alternatives developed during the study, including the "No-Build" alternative.

Ongoing transportation planning, at both regional and local levels, has identified the need for this project. Specifically, the project is needed to improve safety, increase traffic capacity, and provide other heavy trucks a better alternative to the present US 98 route through downtown Brooksville.

To create this alternative truck route, Cobb Road would be upgraded to state highway standards and would then receive the designation of US 98. The existing segment of US 98 north of Brooksville would then be downgraded to the status of a County road. The redesignation of Cobb Road, along with recent improvements to Cortez Boulevard (State Road 50), around the southern end of Brooksville, would provide a more attractive choice for truck drivers, allowing them to bypass downtown Brooksville.

The four-laning of Cobb Road would also improve safety, especially with respect to those times of day when school buses and heavy trucks are both using the facility.

The proposed project is included in the Hernando County Metropolitan Planning Organization's Long Range Transportation Plan. In addition, it is consistent with the County's Adopted Comprehensive Plan and Transportation Improvement Program, and has been endorsed by the City of Brooksville.

Study Segments

To better analyze the study alternatives, the project has been divided into segments, as shown on the map.

- Segment 1 extends from SR 50 to just north of Yontz Road and the railroad crossing.
- Segment 2 extends from just north of the railroad crossing to just west of the Cobb

 –US 98 intersection.
- Segment 3 extends to County Road 491.
- Segment 4 extends from CR 491 to the end of the project, at the Suncoast Parkway.



The Cobb Road/US 98 PD&E Study

A Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study is being conducted by the Florida Department of Transportation for the proposed widening of Cobb Road (County Road 485) and a portion of US 98. The Study proposes to four-lane the entire length of Cobb Road and a portion of US 98 (see map at right). The Study is being conducted to find the most appropriate alignment and design concept for the widening and to determine the potential effects associated with the alternatives developed during the study, including the "No-Build" alternative.

Ongoing transportation planning has identified the need to improve safety, increase traffic capacity, and provide heavy trucks a better alternative to the present US 98 route through downtown Brooksville. To create this alternative truck route, Cobb Road would be upgraded to state highway standards and would then receive the designation of US 98. The existing segment of US 98 north of Brooksville would then become a County road. The redesignation of Cobb Road, along with recent improvements to Cortez Boulevard (State Road 50), around the southern end of Brooksville, would provide a more attractive choice for truck drivers, allowing them to bypass downtown Brooksville. The proposed improvements to Cobb Road would also improve safety, especially with respect to those times of day when school buses and heavy trucks are both using the facility.

The proposed project is included in the Hernando County Metropolitan Planning Organization's Long Range Transportation Plan. In addition, it is consistent with the County's Adopted Comprehensive Plan and Transportation Improvement Program, and has been endorsed by the City of Brooksville.




Recommended Project Alternative







Segment 2 — the recommended alternative would continue with the suburban typical on a left alignment to a point just north of Youth Drive, where it would transition to a rural typical section on a left alignment. The rural typical cross section includes four 12-foot travel lanes, a 46-foot median, and the shared use path on the east side would be continued. The rural typical cross section would require a minimum 240 feet of right-of-way, or approximately 120 feet of additional right-of-way along the west side.



Segments 3 and 4 — The recommended alternative is the rural typical section on a left alignment. The additional 40 feet of right-of-way would be acquired on the southwest side of US 98.

A separate shared use path (trail for pedestrians and bicyclists) is included in each of the recommended typical sections. The separate shared use trail is recommended because it provides a buffer between the non-motorized travelers and the high volume of heavy trucks using the main travel lanes. The recommended improvement also involves designating existing Cobb Road as US 98 to provide a route bypassing downtown Brooksville. The existing Cobb Road intersection with US 98 would be realigned to allow southbound and northbound through movements between existing Cobb Road and US 98 to the north.

The comment that I have is related to the proposed median at the intersection of Fort Dade Avenue and Cobb Road. The -- specifically, you need to keep that open so that you do have through movement running from east to west, west to east for Fort Dade Avenue.

The raised median, basically what that will do is force a lot of residents that live in the northwest part of Hernando County to take the state highway system as opposed to taking secondary roads because of not being able to get access directly across through there at Fort Dade Avenue; plus it will have an impact on the retail gas station that's located there on the northeast corner of that intersection.

I think that as far as recommended design, that's something that should be coordinated between the City of Brooksville, Hernando County Metropolitan Planning Organization and DOT to come up with something that would be suitable for that intersection.

This PD&E study was initiated in April 2001. During the study, a total of six build alternatives and a no-build alternative were analyzed and evaluated. A comprehensive evaluation process was applied during the alternatives analysis period.

Some of the factors used in the evaluation

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process include public comments gained throughout the study period, analysis of traffic projections, ability to accommodate existing and projected traffic, accident history, social and environmental effects, construction and right-of-way costs, as well as consistency of local government comprehensive plans.

The project was divided into four segments. Segment 1, from State Road 50 to north of Yontz Road; Segment 2, from north of Yontz Road to west of the Cobb Road/U.S. 98 intersection; Segment 3, from west of the Cobb Road/U.S. 98 intersection to County Road 491; and Segment 4, from west of County Road 491 to the Suncoast Parkway.

In Segment 1 from State Road 50 to
Wheeling Street, an urban typical section is
proposed. It would have four 12-foot travel
lanes, a 17 1/2-foot curbed median, a 6-foot
sidewalk on the west side, and a 12-foot
shared-use path on the east side of Cobb Road.
This typical section is designed to generally
fit within the existing 100 feet of right of
way.

North of Wheeling Street in Segment 1 to

north of Youth Drive in Segment 2, the recommended alternative transitions to a suburban typical section following a left alignment. Additional right of way needed for the four-lane improvement would be acquired from the west side of Cobb Road.

The suburban typical section would also include four 12-foot travel lanes, a 12-foot shared-use path and a 30-foot-wide median. The suburban typical cross-section would require a minimum of 158 feet of right of way or approximately 38 feet of additional right of way.

For the remainder of the project, from

Youth Drive to the Suncoast Parkway in Segments

2, 3, and 4, the typical would transition to a

rural typical section on a left alignment.

The rural typical section includes four 12-foot travel lanes, a 46-foot median, and a shared-use path on the east side would be continued.

The rural typical cross-section would require a minimum 240 feet of right of way or approximately 120 feet of additional right of way along the west side of Cobb Road,

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and an additional 40 feet of right of way would be acquired on the southwest side of U.S. 98.

A separate shared-use path trail for pedestrians and bicyclists is included in each of the recommended typical sections. The separate shared-use path is recommended because it provides a buffer between the non-motorized travelers and the high volume of heavy trucks using the main travel lanes.

The recommended improvement also involves designating existing Cobb Road as U.S. 98 to provide a route bypassing downtown Brooksville. The existing Cobb Road intersection with U.S. 98 would be realigned to allow southbound and northbound through movements between existing Cobb Road and U.S. 98 to the north.

The no-build alternative consists of only providing routine maintenance and requires no construction costs. However, traffic congestion will continue to increase.

Currently, in the adopted work program for fiscal years 2002/2003 to 2006/2007 Cobb Road from State Road 50 to U.S. 98 is funded for design with a right-of-way reserve also

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programmed; and U.S. 98 from Cobb Road to Citrus Way is also funded for design.

However, in our upcoming tentative work program for fiscal years 2003 to 2004 and 2007/2008, the segment from U.S. 98 -- of U.S. 98 from Cobb Road to Citrus Way has been deferred out of the program.

Details of all of the alternatives and an evaluation matrix are included in the Preliminary Engineering Report, which is available here tonight for your review and comments.

Detailed drawings of the recommended alternative and other graphic materials are displayed here tonight. Please review the materials and provide us your comments.

You may provide your comments by giving an oral statement to the court reporter during the public hearing.

For those of you who prefer to provide written comments, you may complete the comment form included in your handout that can be submitted to the court reporter, dropped in one the comment boxes, or mailed to us at the preprinted address. To be included in the

area. I had flood claims on my property 18
months ago just from tropical storms. Most of
it's surging from the highway, and it surges up
18 inches before the outflows take care of it.
We did not have that problem before they started
putting in water culverts and cleaning up
Highway 98. And I feel that this highway is
going to exacerbate it threefold. That's my
only comment.

My name is Janice Sweatt. I live at 13506 Ponce de Leon Boulevard, Brooksville, Florida 34601. My telephone number is 352-796-6446.

Ever since the Department of

Transportation put in the culverts and

everything, which was done several years ago, we

have had water problems. We have water that

comes up far beyond what we've ever experienced

in all the years that my parents lived there.

We have water almost up to the foundation of our house because of runoff. We have deep gullies that have been cut because of runoff from the road.

We did a lot of fill on our own, then we ran into problems with, I guess you call it Swiftmud, and we had to make sure we didn't break any laws concerning that. We filled with anything that we could get for free.

My father, who is the owner, Adam G.

Broshears, B-R-O-S-H-E-A-R-S, is -- will soon be

90 years old. He loves that place. He and

Mother made their home there for the last 40

years.

For the last 15 to 20 years, myself, my husband and my family have hauled off truckloads

of trash that people dump. They go there fishing, they cut deep roads there; we've had to fill them. We cut down a tree to keep them from coming in.

We've received threats, and we've even been shot at by people that would get angry because they couldn't fish where they wanted to, which was where they could get into.

There is state land bordering my father's property, and I call it my father's because he's still alive, and we keep it clean. We still go over and we pick it up and we haul it away. We go talk to the people that are down there.

Of course you're always afraid of fire.

And they do come down there and camp and they do build fires. It's just a constant battle. And we are getting too old to have to continue these kinds of oppositions.

We have people that said they were from the Department of Transportation come several months ago during the summer and put up stakes in our yard. We didn't -- we talked to them and the other men that were with them made some very negative and unnecessary remarks, and we were told that he worked -- the man that was in

charge that was putting down the stakes, and it says, "right of way, Department of Transportation"; it will take the front part of my father's house. What are we to do?

Swiftmud is going to take one side. The Department of Transportation puts so much runoff into the lake that we will have no place to go. We are willing to make a trade with them, with State, with anybody. And we would like somebody to talk to us instead of come there and just take over and act like they own it. And it's very difficult at our age with our health.

And the lake at the back of the house is a wonderful lake. The fishing is tremendous. It has a lot of water hyacinths. It has a lot of stuff that's come in there that could be cleaned out. And it's called Tain Lake. This lake has good fishing year-round. It has eagles that nest there, owls that come sit on the fence post. Eagles that bring their young there and they sit on a fence post and watch us in the yard.

We have a green falcon. We have some -- I think they're called Great Blue Herons, that have a nest over on the edge of the lake.

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They come in -- men come in there with air boats and they tear it up, and they broke our docks loose. They come from the other side of the lake. We asked them not to, but they just ignore us. They're hunting for alligators, and it's not the Wildlife people.

So we have a lot of issues with a lot of different things, and we're just trying to live peacefully, because it's a beautiful place to live.

There are deer that come and water. They walk almost -- well, they walk within 200 yards of the house, because they're not challenged, and they feed -- they water there. We have raccoons. We have every kind of wildlife you can think of.

When you dig to plant flowers or trees, you find chards from Indians where they used to camp there on that lake so many years ago, and I think it's the kind of place that ought to be kept and not destroyed.

The water runoff is running us out, and it's destroying the lake itself because of the water hyacinths and all of the stuff that's come in there from other places, because they don't

wash their boats and they bring it in there and then it grows. But the lake is a virgin lake and weeds are shadowed there all the time.

We've been able to fish. A lot of people fish there. And we own a good section of the lake, because now it's lake, because the water has gotten so high that we don't have land left.

We're are paying taxes on stuff and we're getting no place. We can't afford to hire a lawyer. We would like to have the opportunity to talk to someone, to have the possibility of a boat landing and make a trade with the State for other land and have it made so that the lake could be used to provide food and recreation, for not just adults, and not to be abused, but for children and families for the future, because it's a beautiful lake. That's it.
