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MR. BOGEN: Good Evening. My name is Kirk Bogen and I am the Project Development Engineer for District 7 of the Florida Department of Transportation. Welcome to the public hearing for the I-75 Project Development and Environment Studies or PD&E Studies. This public hearing is being held relative to State Project Number: 419235-2 as well as State Project Number: 419235-3. The proposed improvements involve I-75 from Moccasin Wallow Road in Manatee County to north of Fletcher Avenue in Hillsborough County.

This hearing is being held to give all interested persons the right to understand the project and comment on their concerns to the Department. Public participation at this hearing is encouraged and solicited without regard to race, color, creed, religion, sex, age, national origin, disability, and family status.

This public hearing is being held in accordance with applicable Federal and State laws. Those citations are listed on the board next to the sign-in table. This public hearing was advertised consistent with federal and state requirements and is being conducted consistent with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. This information is also provided in the project brochure.

Today is Thursday, May 6th, 2010 and it's approximately 6 p.m. We are assembled at the Florida State Fairgrounds, Florida Center in Tampa, Florida. This is your opportunity to receive information on the project and officially comment on the recommended ôBuildö Alternative and other documents available here tonight.

The recommended ôBuildö Alternative is based on comprehensive environmental and engineering analyses completed to date, as well as on public comments that have been received. These projects meet the maximum air quality standards established by the United States Environmental Protection Agency or the EPA.

In addition, the Department proposes to use properties in the vicinity of the Big Bend Road Interchange protected under Section 4(f) of the U.S. Department of Transportation Act. Based on this the Department is seeking a de Minimus finding from the Federal Highway Administration for the proposed use of these properties.

When you arrived this evening you should have received an information packet containing an informational newsletter and a comment form. If you weren't able to sign in or did not receive an information packet, please stop by our sign-in table

before leaving this evening. You also should have had the opportunity to view the audiovisual presentation that is continuously running throughout this public hearing.

One of the unavoidable consequences on a project such as this is the necessary acquisition of properties and the relocation of families and businesses. On this project, we anticipate the relocation of 62 families and 27 businesses. These relocations are marked on the aerial display board.

If you are required to make any type of move as a result of a Department of Transportation project, you can expect to be treated in a fair and helpful manner and in compliance with the Uniform Relocation

Assistance Act. You will be contacted by an appraiser who will inspect your property. We encourage you to be present during this inspection and provide information about the value of your property.

You also may be eligible for relocation advisory service and payment benefits. If you are being moved or you are unsatisfied with the Department's determination of your eligibility for payment or the amount of that payment, you may appeal that determination. You will be promptly furnished necessary forms and notified of the procedures to be

followed in making that appeal.

A special word of caution. If you move before you receive notification of the relocation benefits that you might be entitled to, your benefits may be jeopardized.

The relocation specialists who are supervising this program are Charlene Padgett and Zenia Gallo. They will be happy to answer your questions and you will -- and will also furnish you with copies of relocation assistance brochures. Charlene and Zenia are standing there. Anyone who is involved in a relocation on this project will know whom they are and who they need to see regarding that issue.

Before I continue, I would like to recognize any elected officials or their representatives who are here tonight.

Anyone desiring to make a statement or present written views and/or exhibits regarding the location, conceptual design, social, economic, and environmental effects of the improvements will now have an opportunity to do so. If you have completed a speaker's card, please give them to a Department staff member. If you have not received a speaker's card and wish to speak, please raise your hand so that you can receive a card to complete.

1 Written statements and exhibits may be presented 2 in lieu of or in addition to oral statements. 3 written material received at this public hearing and at the Florida Department of Transportation District 7 4 office located at 11201 North McKinley Drive, Tampa, 5 Florida 33612, postmarked no later than May 17, 2010, 6 7 will become a part of the public record for this hearing. I realize I was told that it's not part of the study, but I think some consideration should be given to looking into other 9 corridors for traffic over the next 50 years in 10 11 Florida. The whole highway system we have was 12 developed after World War II and in other areas of the country projects like this have been done to widen to 13 14 where in New Jersey now we have highways with 16 15 lanes; and we have overlooked the possibility of other avenues, other routes, for example, through the center 16

I don't know who would have to raise that question, but I thought I would bring it up at this period so it would be an avenue to look at.

MR. BOGEN: I will refer you to Mr. Waddah Farah. He may be able to give you some guidance on that. All right. Our third speaker is Tim Wirebjer.

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- 5 MR. WIREBJER: I wasn't quite sure if we are

- 5 MR. WILLIAMS: My name is Bill Williams. I live at
- 6 11114 Kempton Vista Drive, Riverview, Florida 33578. I
- 7 like to speak strongly against the proposed widening of
- 8 I-75. In a well-documented study by several
- 9 transportation institutes, among them Texas Transportation
- 10 Institute, which has been recognized nationally for their
- 11 expertise on transportation issues.
- Widening projects such as this have not reduced
- 13 congestion, but, in fact, according to APTA's Home
- 14 Planning Guide its No-Build alternative is viable in
- dealing with some of the congestion. It is my opinion
- 16 that using the \$2.4 million that would go towards the --
- 17 would instead go towards building public transportation
- 18 systems such as the commuter rail between Bradenton and
- 19 Tampa that's been endorsed by both TBar, HART, and the
- 20 Hillsborough National Planning Organization, would be a
- 21 better alternative.
- The freeway extension would increase traffic and
- 23 benefit some drivers, perhaps. But a transportation line
- 24 would benefit drivers by reducing congestion and people
- 25 who prefer not to drive or because of physical impairments

MR. BOGEN: That was my last speaker card. Is there anyone else that would desire to speak? Seeing none, the verbatim transcript of the hearing's oral proceedings will be made a part of the project decision-making process and will be available at the District 7 office for public review upon request within three weeks.
