FORMAL PRESENTATION

MR. FOX: Good evening. Welcome to the Public Hearing for the McIntosh Road Project Development and Environment, or PD&E Study, and Branch Forbes Road PD&E Study from south of US 92 to north of Interstate 4 in Hillsborough County, a distance of approximately 1.03 miles and 0.86 miles, respectively. The Work Program Item, or WPI, Segment Numbers are 447157-1 for the McIntosh Road PD&E Study and 447159-1 for the Branch Forbes Road PD&E Study.

My name is Craig Fox and I'm the PD&E Project Manager for District Seven of the Florida Department of Transportation, or FDOT. The public hearing was originally scheduled for September 26, 2024, but was rescheduled for today due to Hurricane Helene.

Today is Thursday, November 14, 2024, and it is approximately 6:32 p.m. This public hearing is being held both in person and with an option to attend virtually.

For those attending in person, we are assembled at the Hillsborough Community College Trinkle Center located at 2206 East Cherry Street, Plant City, Florida.

For those attending virtually, thank you for participating on-line via GoToWebinar.

FDOT District Seven, in cooperation with

Hillsborough County, is conducting the public hearing this evening to provide you with an opportunity to discuss both projects and to submit comments on each PD&E Study.

Public participation is encouraged and solicited without regard to race, color, creed, religion, sex, and age, national origin, disability, or family status.

This public hearing is being held and was advised in accordance with applicable Federal and State laws as shown on the citation board next to the sign-in table and is being conducted in accordance with the Americans Disabilities Act of 1990.

This information is also provided in the project newsletter you received in the mail or it can be found at the sign-in table and on-line on each project's website.

The environmental review, consultation, and other actions required by applicable federal environmental laws for this project are being, or have been, carried out by the FDOT pursuant to the 23 United States Code Section 327 and a Memorandum of Understanding dated May 26, 2022, and executed by the Federal Highway Administration and FDOT.

This is your opportunity to receive information on the McIntosh Road PD&E Study and Branch Forbes Road PD&E Study and officially provide your comments to be included

in the public hearing record.

The Preferred Build Alternative for the McIntosh
Road and Branch Forbes Road proposed improvements are
based on environmental and engineering analyses completed
to date, as well as the public comments that we received.

The project teams looked at various environmental effects in the alternative analysis. The project alternatives were evaluated for impacts to Natural and Cultural Resources and on the Social and Physical environments.

Results of the cultural, natural, social and physical environmental analyses are contained in the documents on display here tonight and are available on the project websites.

Staff are available to answer questions regarding these reports.

The results were the following: Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act requires agencies to consider the effects of their actions on Cultural Resources. For McIntosh Road, there were 13 historic resources and no archaeological sites identified within its area of potential effects. For Branch Forbes Road, there were 14 historical resources and one archaeological site identified within its area of potential effects.

None of the cultural resources for either project is

eligible for listing in the National Register of
Historic Places. As a result, there will be no effect
to any of -- to any National Register sites or resources
as a result of either project's proposed improvements.

The Natural Resources assessed as part of each project included wetlands and other surface waters and protected species and habitat.

The widening of McIntosh Road as proposed is estimated to impact approximately 1.63 acres of wetlands and 2.06 acres of other surface waters and the widening of Branch Forbes Road as proposed is estimated to impact 0.78 acre of wetlands and 0.06 acre of other surface waters.

Neither project contains Essential Fish Habitat; therefore, both projects will result in no impacts to Essential Fish Habitat. Both projects will result in minimal effects to species or their habitats; therefore, the proposed p rojects will result in no adverse effects to species or to their habitat.

The Social Environmental results are the effects of the community for accommodation of each projects' roadway widening and anticipated off-site stormwater management facilities and floodplain compensation sites.

The acquisition of additional right-of-way is anticipated for both projects, and 26 parcels may be

affected for McIntosh Road and 38 parcels may be affected for Branch Forbes Road.

The right-of-way acquisition for McIntosh Road is anticipated to involve three residential relocations and two business relocations. The right-of-way acquisition for Branch Forbes Road is anticipated to involve six residential relocations and five business relocations. The potential relocations are shown on each projects' Concept Maps -- Concept Plans.

The Physical Environment was evaluated as a result of each projects' proposed improvements. For McIntosh Road, seven are anticipated to be affected by an increased level of traffic noise. For Branch Forbes Road, 14 properties are anticipated to be affected by an increased level of traffic noise.

There are no locations within either study corridor where potential barriers were determined to be cost reasonable and feasible traffic noise abatement measures.

There are potentially no high risk rated and six
medium risk rated contaminated sites adjacent to McIntosh
Road project improvements, and there are potentially one
high and five medium risk rated contaminated sites
adjacent to the Branch Forbes Road project improvements.
Neither of these sites for either project is expected to
adversely affect the projects.

The purpose of this project is to reduce traffic congestion along with improving safety and system linkage along this portion of McIntosh Road and Branch Forbes Road in Hillsborough County.

The proposed improvements will include adding travel lanes, I-4 on-ramp and off-ramp operational improvements, shared use paths for pedestrians and bicyclists, and construction of stormwater management facilities and floodplain compensation sites.

As shown on each projects' concept plans on display at tonight's hearing and available on-line for virtual attendees, the proposed build alternative for McIntosh Road and Branch Forbes Road are each composed of one preferred typical section. Each projects' typical section accommodates a design speed and target speed of 35 miles per hour for the divided roadway.

Both projects' typical section from US 92 to north of I-4 consists of a divided roadway facility with two 11-foot lanes in each direction and curb and gutter. The proposed travel lanes are separated by a 22 to 54-foot raised median. The typical section also includes a 10-foot shared use path proposed on both sides of the road.

With the introduction of a divided roadway, access to and from adjacent properties and side streets along

both sides of McIntosh Road and Branch Forbes Road will be provided and will enhance safety.

All proposed median opening accesses are shown on each projects' Concept Plans on display at the in-person hearing and on-line for virtual attendees.

This hearing is an opportunity for the public to provide input on each projects' proposed improvements.

The existing right-of-way along McIntosh Road and Branch Forbes Road within the project limits varies from 44 feet to 70 feet wide.

Additional right-of-way will need to be acquired for each project to encompass all elements of the roadway typical section. Additional right-of-way will also be needed to be -- sorry.

Additional right-of-way will also need to be acquired for constructing and maintaining proposed off-site facilities for stormwater management and floodplain compensation along both projects.

The Concept Plans show locations where all right-of-way acquisition is anticipated for each project.

Now I am going to give you some information about right-of-way acquisition and how you can make comments on the project.

On the projects such as this, one of the

unavoidable consequences is the necessary acquisition of properties and the relocation of families and businesses.

For McIntosh Road, we anticipate the relocation of three residences and two businesses. For Branch Forbes Road, we anticipate the relocation of six residences and five businesses.

All right-of-way acquisition will be conducted in accordance with Florida Statute 339.09 and the federal Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, commonly known as the Uniform Act.

If you are required to make any type of move because of a Department of Transportation project, you can expect to be treated in a fair and helpful manner and in compliance with the Uniform Relocation Assistance Act.

If a move is required, you will be contacted by an appraiser who will inspect your property. We encourage you to be present during the inspection and provide information about the value of your property.

You may also be eligible for relocation advisory services and payment benefits. If you are being moved and you are unsatisfied with the Department's determination of your eligibility for payment or the

amount of that payment, you may appeal that determination. You will be promptly furnished necessary forms and notified of the procedures to be followed in making that appeal.

A special word of caution: If you move before you receive notification of the relocation benefits that you might be entitled to, your benefits may be jeopardized.

The acquisition and relocation specialist who is supervising this program are Denise Escobosa -- is Denise Escobosa. They will be happy to answer your questions and will also furnish you with copies of the relocation assistance brochures.

Denise, please stand so that everyone involved can see who you are.

Anyone who is involved with acquisition and relocation on either project now knows who they need to see regarding their property.

For virtual attendees, we have Patricia Berg available to answer your questions in the question box.

For those who arrived in person this evening, you should have received a project newsletter. If you were not able to sign in or did not receive the handout, please stop by our sign-in table before leaving this evening.

MR. FOX: The next speaker is Noelia Trejo. I'm sorry if I mispronounced your name.

MS. TREJO: Hi. Good afternoon. I'm Neolia Trejo.

I live at 5202 Cindy Kay Drive, Plant City, Florida, and

I'm representing on behalf of my family because my mother

isn't here at the moment.

And we do have concerns when it comes to the right-of-way. And I've listened to my fellow Branch Forbes people who live around the area and we do have concerns over the accessibility of how this road will be built.

I have raised my own concerns when it comes to -like we have kids that live there and I have personally
witnessed some near collisions that have been -- like the

buses whenever they stop there have been people driving 50 in the 35, they run over the stop light for the buses, and I am concerned of whenever the kids are dropped off in the afternoon they would have to cross the road and they could get in an accident, and I have almost been in an accident myself. My sister's been in an accident, myself. Some of the other kids have witnessed cars driving pass by whenever the bus comes to a halt, and it does concern me a lot.

And, for instance, my house and property are nearby the road where the sidewalk will be at. We do also have a concern over people who will try to break into our house, and it has happened before. Unfortunately, we have been robbed and my dad had to chase off someone who was on a bike.

So we do want at least a bit of privacy and we do wish to speak to a representative after the meeting about that.

MR. FOX: Thank you for your comment.

MS. TREJO: All right. Thank you.

MR. FOX: Is there anyone else in person who would like to make a public comment?

MS. HANSON: I'm Lindsey Hanson and I also live off of Cindy Kay. And currently in the proposed design structure they have it where there is a median on Branch

Forbes that's going to be there now. So we will be unable to leave Cindy Kay and turn left to get to I-4.

Our only options are to either turn right, go and U-turn to get to I-4, or turn right, go down to 92 to go to McIntosh and get on that way.

It just concerns me because we live right there and making excessive U-turns, and also that U-turn area looks pretty small. If you have a big car, I don't know if you can U-turn right there, if it will fit. And when it comes to -- if we need a big fire truck coming around, if they're coming off of 92 they're going to have to U-turn to get into us, and I don't know if it's big enough for that.

So that's just kind of my concern and comment, is not being able to turn left out of ours.

The next street up, they have a median where they can turn left. They're the one with the bump out. And I don't know why we can't just continue that so we can also turn left too. And we're a dead end street also as well, so that's our only entrance and exit. That's it.

MR. FOX: Thank you for your comment.

So I agree with possibly allowing us the accessibility that I believe it's Keene Road will have in regards to being able to cross the median.

In addition, I also agree with the safety of our children in this area with those roads and those school buses. Thank you.
