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
# 1.0 INTRODUCTION

In June, 2000, Archaeological Consultants, Inc. (ACI) conducted a cultural resource assessment survey (CRAS) of 25 proposed pond site alternatives for the recommended build alternative (Alternative 2: 6<sup>th</sup> Street and U.S. 301) as part of the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for U.S. 301/Zephyrhills from S.R. 39 to C.R. 54 in Pasco County, Florida. Alternative 2 is a one-way pair system using 6<sup>th</sup> Street southbound and U.S. 301 northbound. The purpose of the survey was to locate, identify and bound any prehistoric and historic period archaeological sites and historic structures associated with the proposed pond alternatives, and to assess their significance in terms of eligibility for listing in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) according to the criteria set forth in 36 CFR Section 60.4.

The proposed pond site alternatives are located in Sections 11, 14, and 23 of Township 26 South, Range 21 East, between S.R. 39 at the south and North Avenue at the north (USGS Zephyrhills, Fla. 1975, PR 1987). Pond site locations are shown in Figure 1 and depicted in the appended aerials.

Field survey was preceded by a preliminary cultural resource probability analysis for all potential pond sites along the five preliminary roadway alternatives (ACI 2000b). The purpose of this study was to determine whether any archaeological sites and/or historic structures either listed, eligible, or considered potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP are associated with any proposed pond site for all roadway alternatives. The basis for this work was the CRAS performed as part of the U.S. 301 PD&E Study (ACI 2000a). Each proposed pond site was assigned a ranking of high, moderate, or low probability for archaeological site location on the basis of such variables as distance to a fresh water source, soil type and drainage, relative elevation, and proximity to known sites. Historic structures, defined as those constructed in or before 1950, were identified during a windshield type survey. These resources were not recorded during the probability analysis.

For Alternative 2, the probability analysis indicated that no archaeological sites or historic structures either listed, eligible, or considered potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP are associated with any of the 25 proposed ponds. No recorded archaeological sites were found to be located within any of the proposed ponds. 8PA1206, a small lithic scatter discovered and recorded during the PD&E Study (ACI 2000a), is located directly south of proposed Pond 2-11. Seven of the proposed pond sites were considered to have a moderate potential for archaeological site occurrence, and 18 were deemed to have a low site probability (Table 1). Twenty-four recorded historic structures were found to be associated with 11 of the proposed ponds (Table 1). Windshield survey of the project area, and supplementary research at the Pasco County Property Appraiser's Office indicated an additional four unrecorded historic structures within three of the proposed pond sites (2-17, 2-18 and 2-21), also shown on Table 1.

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In accordance with these prior findings, the seven proposed pond site alternatives classified as moderate probability were archaeologically surveyed. As a result, one previously recorded archaeological site (8PA1206) was found to extend into proposed Ponds 2-11 and 2-12. This lithic scatter type site, originally discovered during the archaeological survey of the U.S. 301 PD&E Study project area (ACI 2000a:6-1), is not considered significant in terms of the NRHP eligibility criteria. Cultural resource assessment survey of the 25 proposed pond sites also resulted in the identification and recording of four historic structures located within proposed Ponds 2-17 (8PA1284 and 8PA1285), 2-18 (8PA1283), and 2-21 (8PA1286). None is adjudged potentially eligible for NRHP listing. A summary of survey methods and results follows.

#### 2.0 METHODS

Archaeological field survey included both ground surface examination and systematic and judgmental subsurface testing within the seven proposed pond site alternatives considered to have a moderate site location potential. Systematic subsurface shovel testing was carried out at 82 and 164 feet intervals. Shovel tests were circular and measured approximately 20 inches in diameter by at least 3.3 feet in depth, and all soil removed was screened through .25 inch mesh hardware cloth to maximize the recovery of artifacts. The locations of all shovel tests were plotted on the aerial maps, and following the recording of relevant data such as stratigraphic profile and artifact finds, all test pits were refilled.

All recovered cultural materials, consisting only of lithic debitage (waste flakes), were initially cleaned, then subjected to a limited technological analysis focused on ascertaining the stages of stone tool production. Flakes were measured, examined for raw material type and absence or presence of thermal alteration, and classified into four types on the basis of the amount of cortex on the dorsal surface: primary decortication, secondary decortication, non-decortication, and shatter. No lithic tool forms, or other artifacts, were recovered. At the completion of the cultural resource assessment survey, the artifacts and inventory sheet were prepared for permanent storage and curation at a FDOT-designated repository; they are currently stored at ACI pending request for transfer.

Historic resources field survey consisted of an in-depth study of the four structures identified previously during the Probability Analysis (ACI 2000b). Photographs were taken and information needed for the completion of FSF forms was gathered. In addition to architectural descriptions, each historic structure was reviewed to assess style, historic context, condition, and potential NRHP eligibility. Pertinent records housed at the Pasco County Property Appraiser's Office were examined, and residents or other knowledgeable persons were interviewed to obtain information concerning site-specific building construction dates and/or possible association with individuals or events significant to local or regional history.

# 3.0 RESULTS

Background research and archaeological and historical resources field surveys resulted in the identification and evaluation of 29 cultural resources including one archaeological site and 28 historic structures. Collectively, these resources are located within 13 of the 25 proposed pond site alternatives for the recommended build alternative (Alternative 2). These finding are summarized in Table 1.




Figure 2. Location of Shovel Tests (STs) within Proposed Ponds 2-11 and 2-12, plus selected STs from the PD&E Study. Original and revised boundaries of 8PA1206 are delineated. Positive STs are filled circles; negative are unfilled circles. Scale 1 inch = 100 feet

3.1 Archaeological Survey Results: Archaeological field survey included ground surface reconnaissance and the excavation of a total 38 shovel tests (STs) within the seven proposed ponds considered to have a moderate site location potential. As a result, a portion of the previously recorded Shepard Park Site (8PA1206) was found to extend into proposed Ponds 2-11 and 2-12. The original and revised site boundaries are illustrated in Figure 2 and a brief site description follows. An updated FSF form is appended to this memorandum; the original is contained in Appendix A of the CRAS Report.

8PA1206: The Shepard Park Site was originally discovered during the archaeological survey of the U.S. 301 PD&E Study project area conducted by ACI (ACI 2000a). The site, as originally recorded, is situated along the east side of 6<sup>th</sup> Street at the extreme western edge of Shepard Park, in the northwest quarter of Section 14, Township 26 South, Range 21 East (USGS Zephyrhills, Fla. 1975, PR 1987). The site, evidenced by a total of eight coral waste flakes, was estimated to measure approximately 50 feet north/south by no more than 50 feet east/west (ACI 1000a:6-1). 8PA1206 was evaluated as not NRHP eligible.

Archaeological subsurface testing within proposed Ponds 2-11 and 2-12, located immediately north of Shepard Park, indicated that 8PA1206 extends roughly 400 feet north of A Avenue to just south of South Avenue (Figure 2). Of the total 14 shovel tests excavated within the two proposed pond site alternatives, seven produced a total of 20 pieces of lithic debitage (waste flakes). In addition, a small amount of historic refuse was found, including one clear glass bottle fragment, a piece of whiteware, and one butchered bone. Nine other animal bone fragments, including turtle and unidentified mammal, are probably associated with the aboriginal component. The debitage assemblage includes 11 chert and nine coral waste flakes. All of the coral flakes have been thermally altered and 64% of the chert debitage was heat treated. Most of the waste flakes were classified as medium-sized and non-decortication in type. Spatially, the prehistoric lithic component is located within both proposed pond sites, while the small amount of historic domestic refuse is confined to the northern half of proposed Pond 2-12.

With the exception of a change in geographical boundaries and the addition of a small historic period component, little new information was gathered about the Shepard Park Site. As contained within proposed Ponds 2-11 and 2-12, 8PA1206 is estimated to measure

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approximately 400 feet north/south by 200 feet east/west. Given the sparse and non-diagnostic nature of the artifact assemblage recovered, the temporal/cultural affiliation of the prehistoric component is unknown; the historic refuse component probably dates to the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. Residential development within the site area has resulted in substantial disturbance. The research potential of the site is considered low, and hence, 8PA1206 does not appear to be eligible for listing in the NRHP.

3.2 <u>Historic Structures Survey Results</u>: Historical/architectural field survey resulted in the identification of 28 historic resources, including 24 previously recorded and four newly recorded (8PA1283 through 8PA1286) structures. Descriptions of the four newly recorded historic structures are provided below, and completed FSF forms are appended. Relevant descriptive information for the 24 previously recorded historic structures is contained in the PD&E Study CRAS Report (ACI 2000a), and summarized below in Table 2.

8PA1283: This Ranch style residence, built <u>ca.</u> 1950, is located within proposed Pond 2-18 at 38227 7th Avenue. The immediate area is largely residential. The rectangular one-story building is constructed of concrete block which remains the exterior fabric. It has a continuous concrete block foundation, a hip roof, an interior brick chimney, and eight- and 12-light metal casement windows. A porch with a hip roof protrudes from the main block of the building on the south elevation. A small metal shed is located north of the residence. This building is typical of Ranch style homes constructed during the post-World War II era. The limited data available did not indicate any historical significance. Therefore, 8PA1283 does not appear <u>NRHP</u> eligible.

8PA1284: This Ranch style residence, located within proposed Pond 2-17 at 38213 7th Avenue, was constructed <u>ca.</u> 1950. It is situated in a residential area. The concrete block structural system of the irregularly-shaped one-story building is surfaced with stucco. The building features a continuous concrete block foundation, a hip roof, an interior brick chimney, and a slightly inset porch under a hip roof on the south facade. Windows are eight-and 12-light metal casement, two-light awning, and 2/2 single-hung sash. A small room

addition was built on the east elevation <u>ca.</u> 1970 and a larger room was built <u>ca.</u> 1985 to connect this addition to the original garage. Around the same time, a carport was built attached to the garage. A <u>ca.</u> 1985 shed is situated north of the residence. Multiple additions have diminished the architectural integrity of this typical Ranch style residence. Furthermore, no historic significance was evident in the limited information available on this building. Thus, 8PA1284 does not appear to merit <u>NRHP</u> listing.

8PA1285: This <u>ca.</u> 1950 residence is located within proposed Pond 2-17 at 5318 5th Street. It is located within a residential neighborhood. The irregularly-shaped one-story Frame Vernacular building has a continuous masonry foundation, an exterior surface of stucco, a combination gable and shed roof, and an exterior brick chimney. The original building has 1/1 double-hung sash windows while subsequent additions have two-light awning windows. The gable end has a vent. Metal awnings and decorative shutters have been added at the windows. A room was constructed on the east elevation <u>ca.</u> 1975. Around 1980 a carport was built on the south elevation to connect the <u>ca.</u> 1950 shed to the house and a porch was added on the west facade. Stucco was applied to the building during the same time period. Limited research did not reveal any historical significance. This structure is typical of Frame Vernacular buildings found throughout Zephyrhills and Pasco County. Therefore, 8PA1285 does not appear <u>NRHP</u> eligible.

8PA1286: The duplex located within proposed Pond 2-21 at 38025-31 13th Avenue was constructed in a largely residential area <u>ca.</u> 1950. Built in the Frame Vernacular style, the rectangular one-story duplex has a continuous concrete block foundation, vinyl siding, a gable roof, and 1/1 double-hung sash and three-light awning windows. A porch with a shed roof is located on the south facade. Alterations include the <u>ca.</u> 1970 replacement of some original windows, and the <u>ca.</u> 1985 application of vinyl siding over the original siding. A <u>ca.</u> 1950 shed is east of the residence, and a <u>ca.</u> 1995 carport is southeast of the duplex. Alterations to this typical Frame Vernacular duplex have diminished its architectural integrity. In addition, limited research did not reveal any historical significance. Therefore, 8PA1286 does not appear <u>NRHP</u> eligible.

#### 4.0 CONCLUSIONS

Archaeological and historical/architectural survey of selected proposed pond site alternatives for the recommended build alternative (Alternative 2) indicated that no archaeological sites or historic structures either listed, eligible, or potentially eligible for listing in the NRHP are associated with any proposed pond site. Previously recorded archaeological site 8PA1206 was found to extend into proposed Ponds 2-11 and 2-12. Given the limited and mundane nature of the artifact assemblage, and the limited potential to yield archaeological data of significance to regional prehistory, this site is considered to be not NRHP eligible. Similarly, the four newly recorded and 24 previously recorded historic structures located

within 13 of the proposed pond sites also were found not to meet the criteria of eligibility for listing in the <u>NRHP</u>. In conclusion, no proposed pond site alternative should be excluded from selection on the basis of cultural resource considerations.


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
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
