Description of Property:

Whispering Pines Park is approximately 299.828 acres located at 1700 Forest Drive, Inverness, FL 34453. The park is part of the Citrus Tract of the Withlacoochee State Forest (WSF) which is approximately 168,000 acres. The Whispering Pines Park is owned by the Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund (TIITF), leased by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (FDACS), and subleased by the City of Inverness.

Whispering Pines Park was created in 1965, to use for recreation. The management of the entire complex is accomplished by the City of Inverness Department of Parks & Recreation. City of Inverness is responsible for establishment and operation of recreational activities, facilities, and interpretive/educational programs. FDACS, WSF is responsible for cultural, invasive species, silvicultural, and wildlife activities.

Whispering Pines Park contains numerous recreational amenities, including trails for hikers and off-road bicyclists, shelters, athletic fields, athletic courts, swimming pool complex, and playground.

Basis on Which the Determination was Made

Throughout the US 41 PD&E Study, Design Change Re-evaluation, and more recently during the Construction Advertisement Re-evaluation, the FDOT has coordinated with the FDACS and the City of Inverness to minimize impacts to the WSF, to provide mitigation for unavoidable impacts, and to provide benefits and accommodate requests by the FDACS. These actions are consistent with Chapter 253, Florida Statutes, and the policy established by the Board of Trustees (BOT) of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund for the Use of Natural Resource Lands by Linear Facilities and the Board's Policy for Incompatible Use of Natural Resource Lands.

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To offset the unavoidable impacts to Park FDOT will provide the following as additional compensation:

- Provide to the Trustees a total of 16.511 acres (more or less), of replacement lands located at 15377 Samons Road in Brooksville, Hernando County.
- Restore the existing boundary fence along the new western right-of-way line of US 41 adjacent to the Park.
- Reconstruct the existing jogging/maintenance trail alongside the new boundary fence.
- Plant native trees and shrubs adapted to a sandhill site within the areas disturbed by construction.
- Long leaf pine survey for timber harvest by FFS within the proposed easement areas.
- Construct a new Park entrance across from the main entrance of the Inverness Regional Shopping Center.

Public Involvement Activities:

The FDOT notified the City of Inverness of our intent to pursue a Section 4(f) *de Minimis* determination on June 23, 2022. An Opportunity for Public Review and Comment was advertised on the project website, FDOT social media, in the Tampa Bay Times and Citrus County Chronicle, and within the Whispering Pines Park on July 10, 2022. A 17-day public comment period was initiated and ran until July 27, 2022. No public comments regarding the Whispering Pines Park were received.

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Withlacoochee State Trail

Description of Property:

Withlacoochee State Trail is a 46 mile long paved 12 foot wide trail located at 3100 South Old Floral City Road, Inverness, FL 34450. It is officially designated as part of the Florida Greenways and Trail System and this state trail is also designated as a National Recreation Trail.

In the late 1800s, railroad entrepreneur Henry Plant established a rail line that ran from Croom to Inverness, Florida, thus completing the Plant System's West Coast Route. The Plant System eventually became the Atlantic Coast Line in 1902, the Seaboard Coast Line in 1967, and finally, CSX Transportation in 1980. In December 1989, CSX Transportation sold their 46 miles of ROW between Gulf Junction (Citrus Springs) and Owensboro Junction, six miles north of Dade City, to the state of Florida to establish the Withlacoochee State Trail. The corridor was one of the first purchased under the Florida Rails to Trails Program. The Withlacoochee State Trail is one of the longest, paved rail-trails in Florida.

Major activities that can take place on the Withlacoochee State Trail includes, but is not limited to, walking, biking, skating, horseback riding, bird watching, and viewing plants and wildlife.

Recommended Outcome: Exception/Exemption

Exception/Exemption Type: Improvement of railroad or rail transit lines that are or were in use for transportation purposes, provided the conditions in 23 CFR 774.13(a)(2) are met.

Exception/Exemption Justification:

Withlacoochee State Trail meets the circumstance in 23 CFR 774.13(a)(2) Improvement of railroad or rail transit lines that are in use or were historically used for the transportation of goods or passengers, including, but not limited to, maintenance, preservation, rehabilitation, operation, modernization, reconstruction, and replacement of railroad or rail transit line elements. Access to the Withlacoochee State Trail will be maintained during construction. The connection to the Withlacoochee State Trail will be improved with the construction of two shared use path connections along northbound and southbound US 41.

Description of Property:

Inverness Middle School is approximately 29.08 acres located at 1950 US 41 North, Inverness, FL 34450. The property is owned by the Citrus County School Board.

Inverness Middle School contains recreational amenities, including a soccer/football field, two softball fields, and four basketball/tennis courts. These existing recreational amenties are not abutting or adjacent to the proposed improvements for US 41. See attached the Inverness Middle School Recreational Facilities Map.

Access to Inverness Middle School is off of Middle School Road. The recreational amenties are also located off of Middle School Road. There is no direct access from US 41 and fencing is being installed between US 41 right-of-way and the recreational facilities within the Inverness Middle School property.

Owner/Official with Jurisdiction: Citrus County School Board

Relationship Between the Property and the Project

The Inverness Middle School property abuts northbound US 41 between Middle School Road and with Withlacoochee State Trail. Along this portion of the project includes widening the mainline of US 41 in addition to constructing a 12-foot wide shared use path that ties into the proposed 6-foot sidewalk to the south and Withlacoochee State Trail to the north. Additional right-of way is also being acquired for the widening of the driveway at Middle School Drive. This will also allow for better turning movement for buses at this location. A protective fence barrier is also being installed by the FDOT within the School Board parcel at the request of the School Board to limit access to the roadway and existing drainage facilities along US 41.

The FDOT purchased right-of-way from the Citrus County School Board in August 2021 including Parcels 124A and 124B to accommodate mainline improvements, Temporary Construction Easement 700 for drainage, and Cure Agreement 900 for the installation of fencing.



Dear Mr. Williams,

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is designing improvements to US 41 State Road (SR) 45 from SR 44 to south of the Withlacoochee Trail Bridge in Citrus County. SR 44 to Montgomery Avenue is approximately 0.40 miles in length and improvements will include an urban 5-lane facility roadway with two 11-foot travel lanes, a 6-foot bike lane in both directions separated by a 12-foot bi-directional center left turn lane with a design speed of 40 mph. The section from Montgomery Avenue to south of Withlacoochee Trail Bridge is approximately 0.70 miles in length and improvements will include an urban 4-lane divided facility roadway with two 11-foot travel lanes, a 6-foot bike lane, 5-foot sidewalk in both directions. The alignment of the proposed widening is designed to minimize impacts to the greatest extent possible. The project also includes the construction of stormwater management facility (SMF) sites to offset surface water impacts along the project corridor.

The environmental review, consultation, and other actions required by applicable federal environmental laws for this project are being, or have been, carried out by FDOT pursuant to 23 U.S.C. § 327 and a Memorandum of Understanding dated May 26, 2022 and executed by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and FDOT. A Project Development and Environment approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) on February 21, 1996. A Design approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) on Rebruary 21, 1996. A Design Change Reevaluation was completed and approved by FHWA on August 4, 1999. The Design Change Reevaluation documented the Preferred Alternative widening to the west of US 41 (SR 45) into Whispering Pines Park.

Because the project involves a National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA) action, an evaluation of potential recreational impacts for the resources protected under Section 4(f) of the US Department of Transportation Act was required. As a result, a Section 4(f) Programmatic Determination was approved by FHWA on August 4, 1999 in coordination with The Florida

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services' Florida Forest Service (FFS; formerly Division of Forestry [DOF]) and the City of Inverness, which included a mitigation plan to offset unavoidable impacts to Whispering Pines Park. Since the Section 4(f) Programmatic Determination was approved, pond siting and design changes required additional right-of-way, thereby necessitating an updated Section 4(f) Determination. Based on the Final Concept Development Plans, additional right-of-way needs, and the proposed improvements to the Whispering Pines Park included with the project, the FDOT has determined that the project qualifies as a Section 4(f) de Minimis pursuant to Title 23 Code of Federal Regulations Part 774 (23 CFR 774).

The purpose of this letter is to seek your written concurrence for the Section 4(f) de Minimis determination consistent with 23 CFR 774, that the proposed project will not result in adverse effects to the activities, features, or attributes of the Whispering Pines Park that qualify under Section 4(f). A de Minimis impact involves the use of Section 4(f) property that is generally minor in nature. A de Minimis impact is one that, after taking into account avoidance, minimization, mitigation, and enhancement measures, results in no adverse effects to the activities, features, or attributes qualifying a park, recreation area, or refuge for protection under Section 4(f).

As the Official with Jurisdiction, on June 1, 1983, you provided input that Whispering Pines Park qualifies as a public recreation area. FDOT notified you of our intent to pursue a Section (f) de Minimis determination on June 23, 2022. An Opportunity for Public Review and Comment was advertised on July 10, 2022. A 17-day public comment period was initiated and ran until July 27, 2022. No public comments regarding the Whispering Pines Park were received.

FDOT now requests concurrence on the de Minimis determination. If you concur with the FDOT's assessment that the widening of US 41 will result in de minimis impacts to Whispering Pines Park, then please sign and date the concurrence block at the bottom of this letter and return it to my attention at the address below.

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
